Job Summary

Under the direction and guidance of the Director of Allied Care and Health Promotion, the Occupational Therapist works with the Health Promotion, Outreach and Clinical Programs of Nine Circles Community Health Centre to provide high-quality care for persons living with HIV, and, increase client access to rehabilitation services at Nine Circles and in the community.

The job is part-time, 62 hours per two-week period (including holiday pay hours). The regular work days for this position will fall between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Occasional weekends may be required.

The position is classified as Group "Occupational Therapist", on the CUPE Local 204 salary scale. A comprehensive benefit package is provided as per employee eligibility via HEB Manitoba.

Key Responsibilities

General Duties:

- Provide occupational therapy services to enable clients to achieve and maintain optimal health and social outcomes by working independently and as a member of an interdisciplinary team
- Plan and implement outcome-oriented services, evaluate the effectiveness of the services, prepare and maintain records
- Documentation in client files as appropriate and required
- Initiate referrals to other Nine Circles Community Health Centre services and/or external services or supports
- Facilitate individual and group-based interventions and supports based on client need and therapeutic objectives
- Coordinate other internal and/or external service providers through consultation or case review processes
- Ensure meaningful participation opportunities for people living with HIV in program and resource design, delivery and evaluation

Education:

- Facilitate education sessions with professionals, community members, and clients regarding the role of rehabilitation in HIV care and support

Program Development – Allied Health:

- Participate in interdisciplinary teamwork and contribute to the development, review and promotion of rehabilitation resources and services
- Develop and maintain program work plan and appropriate outcomes, deliverables, and documentation
- Contribute to the integration of rehabilitation services into the Nine Circles model of service delivery

- Advocacy with and for clients in relation to social justice, social integration, and rehabilitation services
- Other related duties as assigned by, and negotiated with, management

- Minimum of a Baccalaureate degree in Occupational Therapy or Rehabilitation Sciences from a recognized program
- Current and ongoing registration with the College of Occupational Therapists of Manitoba in good standing
