# **Key Responsibilities and Duties**

## **RESEARCH ASSISTANT - 80%**

- 1) Conduct interviews with study participants (80%) by:
  - a) Collaborating with the Research Team, community organizations and partners, and peer networks to recruit participants
  - e) Conducting interviews with study participants living with HIV by telephone using a computer
  - g) Completing a representative journey map during each interview
  - h) Attending and providing guidance for study participants at focus group workshops
  - i) Working with the study team to analyze the interview data at team meetings

## TRAINING & COMMUNICATION - 20%

- 2) Participate in job training (10%) by:
  - a) Attending a 1-2 day CRA a training session that will be held virtually
  - b) Completing additional on-line training (Tri Council Policy Statement 2: Course on Research Ethics, and refresher sessions held virtually, University of Manitoba Researcher Privacy (PHIA & FIPPA)
  - c) Engaging in self-learning before and after each training phase
  - d) Becoming familiar with research related materials (e.g., consent form, questionnaires and the study protocol)
- 3) Collaborate with all members of the research team (10%) by:
  - a) Participating in regular study team meetings to discuss interview-related issues and to support fellow CRAs
  - b) Seeking advice and support from the project team leaders when needed and respond to requests from the project team leaders in a timely manner
  - c) Returning all completed study materials to the Principal Investigator or designate (e.g., consent forms, honorarium receipts)
  - d) Communicating with participants, team members and community partners in a respectful and professional manner
- 4) Maintain confidentiality of all research related information in accordance with PHIA and FIPPA legislation and the study protocol.
- 5) Other duties as assigned

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

## MINIMUM FORMAL EDUCATION/TRAINING REQUIRED:

Grade 12 or Equivalent.

## **EXPERIENCE:**

HIV-positive individuals from traditionally marginalized or silenced communities are encouraged to apply, including men who have sex with men, lesbian, bi, queer and transgendered people; racialized and Indigenous communities; and other individuals from groups who have been historically under-represented in health research.

- 1. Intimate understanding of the experience of living with HIV
- 2. Past experience and/or interest in research
- 3. Past experience and/or interest in working with HIV positive peers
- 4. Minimum of 1-year experience working in a formal employment or volunteer capacity with an HIV-related organization.

- 5. Basic computer skills (e.g., comfortable using a computer, typing, sending emails, and accessing the internet);
- 6. Effective oral and written communication skills
- 7. Average (or above) literacy skills (e.g., reading, comprehension, writing)

- 1. Ability to consistently demonstrate compassion and understanding towards issues related to diversity, inequality, stigma and discrimination, and the needs of people living with HIV
